Journal Guidelines

Call for Submissions

PIXEL - the Cambridge Undergraduate Journal of Development Economics is looking for papers, essays and articles on topics in the field of economic development. Eligible to submit are all undergraduate students. The journal accepts submissions from all around the world, therefore as long as the submission is on economic development, it will be reviewed.

Papers and essays written for classes, honours theses, based on fieldwork experience or written independently are welcome. The papers and essays need not focus on current issues, they may be historical in nature. Multiple submissions and co-authored papers are allowed. The submissions should reflect a sharp intellect, critical thinking, perceptiveness, as well as originality and creativity.

In the spirit of making previously unheard voices heard and to eliminate the bias against undergraduates at universities where English is not the language of instruction, PIXEL - the Cambridge Undergraduate Journal of Development Economics is now accepting submissions in the following languages as well:

- Dutch
- French
- German
- Hungarian
- Italian
- Spanish

For submissions in languages other than those listed please contact us (pixelthejournal@gmail.com) as we may be able to consider the paper anyway.

Articles will be edited in their original language and will be published in English as well as in the language they were originally written in.

Submission Checklist:

- 1) Consider whether the topic of your work is relevant, the journal will only consider submissions regarding development economics.
- 2) Prepare your manuscript accordingly. It is important that your submission(s) adheres to the style and format described below.
- 3) Submit by e-mail to pixelthejournal@gmail.com.
- 4) Get involved during the editorial process when revisions are requested. The submission deadline for the current issue is the 1st of September; the authors of accepted manuscripts will be notified around October-November with revisions being required in November-December. If in the meantime you decide to withdraw your article please let us know as soon as possible.

Format and Style

Manuscripts should be presented in a clear and consistent manner, and should adhere to the basic PIXEL guidelines as detailed below. Nonetheless, authors should feel free to exercise their creativity and discretion while keeping with these basic guidelines. Any questions regarding format and style are welcomed.

- *Cover Page*
 - title of paper
 - full name and e-mail address of author(s)
 - program of study, name and address of university
 - abstract (max 300 words)

- *Document*
 - length: max 7000 words, only in exceptional circumstances will the editors consider manuscripts exceeding this
 - font: Calibri, 11-point font, 1.5 spacing
 - include page numbers, do not include other headers/ footers/ special formatting (lines etc)
 - number sections using Arabic numerals
 - use British English spelling
 - acronyms are to be spelt out in first instance, after which abbreviations can be used

- *Charts and Tables*
 - include charts and tables only if necessary and referred to in the text
 - number all charts and tables, include them in an Appendix and refer to them in the text by number, captions to begin with 'Table/Chart #:'
 - sources for tables should be cited below each table: 'Source:...'
